Sussex Breed

Description: Long, broad, flat back; a long and straight breastbone; wide shoulders; and a rectangular build. The tail is held at a 45-degree angle from the body. The eyes are red in the darker varieties but orange in the lighter ones. The comb is single. The earlobes are red and the legs and skin white in every variety.

Colour: The light Sussex has a white body with a black tail and black in the flight feathers and wing coverts; the neck hackles are white with black striping

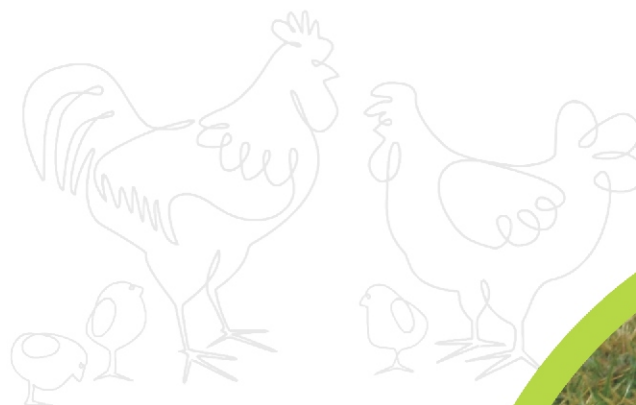
Skin colour: White

Egg colour: Cream / Light brown

Use: Dual-purpose breed: eggs, meat

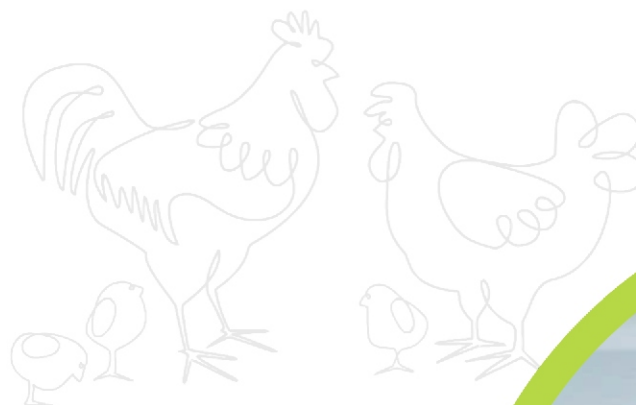
Weights: Cocks 4 - 4.1 kg and hens 3 - 3.2 kg

Useful to Know: Hardy, fast maturing, rarely go broody and are good for beginners

Black Australorp Breed

Description: Standard black plumage that often has a glossy green sheen when seen in the sunlight. They are a clean legged, 4-toed breed and their shanks are a black to dark slate in colour. The eyes are dark brown, a black beak, and red facial features.

Colour: Black

Skin colour: White

Egg colour: Brown

Use: Dual-purpose breed: eggs, meat.

Weights: Cocks 3.2 – 4.1 kg and hens 2.2 – 3.1 kg.

Useful to Know: Famous for laying more than 300 eggs per year.

Buff Orpington Breed

Description: They are very large, heavy, and fluffy chickens with a U-shaped silhouette. They have a stocky build and a broad body with short backs and legs. You can usually only see a tiny bit of leg showing from underneath their loose, prolific feathering. They are loosely feathered and appear to be heavier than their true weight. They have upright, medium-sized single combs, medium-sized wattles, and red earlobes.

Colour: Light brown

Egg colour: Brown

Use: Dual-purpose breed: eggs, meat.

Useful to Know: Are a docile breed with excellent mothering skills laying eggs from 6 months of age and can lay around 200 eggs per year. They are friendly and affectionate, making them the perfect breed for children. They are cold hardy and very broody, making them a great choice for the backyard homestead. Can tolerate confinement but also have good foraging ability.

Koek Koek Breed

Description: They have a large body structure for meat production, suited to subsistence farmers

Colour: Black-and-white barred

Egg colour: Brown

Use: Dual-purpose breed: eggs, meat

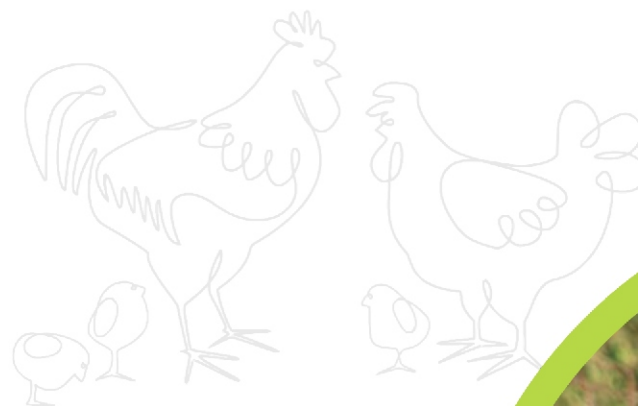
Weights: Cocks 2.4+ kg and hens 1.7+ kg.

Useful to Know: They are happy, active and great foragers. Very hardy and easy to keep, have excellent laying capabilities and can maintain good egg production even during poor or insufficient feeding, known to lay 200 eggs per year. Chicks are sexable soon after hatching due to distinct sex markings. They reach sexual maturity between 4 to 5 months of age

Malay Game Breed

Description: A breed of game chicken, it is among the tallest breeds of chicken, and may stand over 90 cm high.

Colour: Black, black-red, pile, spangled and white.

Skin colour: White

Egg colour: Brown

Use: Meat, show

Weights: Cocks 5 kg and hens 4.1 kg

Useful to Know: Heat tolerant. Hens may lay approximately 80 eggs per year

Boschveld Breed

Description: Medium sized breed

Colour: Distinctive red and brown colour

Use: Dual-purpose breed: eggs, meat

Weights: Cocks 2.6 kg and hens 1.7 kg

Useful to Know: Cocks are strong and aggressive, hens are very fertile with strong, healthy offspring that grow well. Egg production starts at 24 weeks with production per hen per week being 4 eggs. They have the ability to resist many bacterial diseases and forage. Low input breed which is highly suitable for small-holder farming situations. They can withstand extreme heat and cold, are alert with strong survival skills and hardy in free range conditions. Cocks are ready for slaughter at 12 weeks old, depending on nutritional levels
